Introduction

The Social Business Accelerator (SBA) program of the Polish Private Equity and Venture Capital Association (PSIK) is celebrating its **10**th **anniversary**.

The program engages leading private equity and venture capital investment professionals to contribute their time and know-how to social purpose organizations (SPOs) that address Poland's most pressing social issues.

Looking back over ten years of activity, it is evident that the SBA program is a great success. It represents an unparalleled mobilization of the most senior private equity managers to engage on a personal level, and fully pro bono, with social entrepreneurs. There is no other program in Europe with such a high level of private equity community engagement.




To date, SBA has launched 10


annual editions of the program.

A total of 65

private equity professionals have engaged in it over the last decade



to mentor 85 social purpose organizations.





An estimated

5,000

hours

have been contributed by the private equity mentors so far.

Additional significant contributions have been made by professional consultants and support firms who provided pro bono support to mentors and the SPOs.

What is the SBA?

The SBA is a pro bono initiative of Poland's private equity and venture capital community.

It started in **2011** from the observation that both social purpose organizations and commercial business ventures struggle with the same types of problems.





This led to the conclusion that the private equity toolkit applied in commercial companies could be used for the benefit of social purpose organizations.

The program relies on the engagement of senior private equity managers (PSIK mentors) who contribute their private time to work one-on-one with the leaders of selected social purpose organizations.

It is run in the form of annual editions lasting from September to June. Mentors are paired with SPOs at the beginning of each edition and then have monthly meetings throughout the year. Pairs sometimes work through two, three or more editions of the program. Having completed their work with a given organization, many mentors stay in the program and continue with another social entrepreneur.

Social purpose organizations

During the course of each SBA program edition, PSIK mentors and SPO leaders define the issues and projects they wish to work on, with the overarching goal of achieving greater social impact by the organization.

Support is provided much in the same way that private equity managers work with their investment fund portfolio companies. Mentors tap into their business development skills, use their contacts and other relevant resources, and seek to help develop the organization for the longer term. When needed, their work has been supported by the pro bono engagement of professional services firms from the PSIK Associate Members' community.



A Short History of the SBA

The SBA was conceived in 2011 by the PSIK Philanthropy Committee (then co-headed by Robert Manz and Piotr Noceń) together with the Polish branch of Ashoka (then led by Ewa Konczal).

The idea was developed after consultation with numerous private equity managers on how to bring the concept of venture philanthropy to life in Poland.




A great willingness to engage at a personal level and reciprocal strong interest on the side of social purpose organizations to get support from senior members of the business community gave rise to the first edition of the SBA, which was launched in November 2011.

During the first four years, the SBA was run as a joint venture between PSIK and Ashoka. Most of the SPOs invited to the program in its early editions were from the ranks of Ashoka Fellows. From September 2015, the fourth edition, the SBA program has been managed jointly by PSIK and the Valores Foundation.

There have been **ten editions** of the program:

Valores, established in 2014 as the first venture philanthropy fund in Poland, works in an integrated way with the SBA. It provides financial and non-financial support to selected social purpose organizations that excel in the SBA program and show potential for further scaling up. PSIK mentors continue to support those SPOs that move into the Valores portfolio for a three-year period.



During the course of each SBA annual edition, participants meet for a group kick-off in September and then set about working in their pairs in regular monthly sessions. Typically, a second group meeting is held in the middle of the edition to share experiences and best practices among the participants.



PSIK Mentors

Only the most senior private equity and venture capital professionals – those with at least ten years' experience – are invited to participate in the SBA program.

This is important because broad and deep business experience is needed to help the participating SPOs assess the key issues facing them and guide the organizations to begin structured work to address those issues.








Most mentors spend more than the minimum required two hours per month working with their organizations.

PSIK mentors have often brought in additional resources as needed to support their allocated SPO. These can include the pro bono services of members of their own investment firm's team, PR firms, recruitment firms, legal support, tax and accounting, and other resources.

Each year the most active PSIK mentors are recognized at the annual private equity awards ceremony, with the Social Business Accelerator Mentor of the Year award.



The SBA program represents unique engagement by the private equity industry in the social sector.

Considering its success and level of personal mobilization, SBA can act as a model for true and impactful social action by business communities in other countries.

Social Purpose Organizations

Social purpose organizations are invited to join the SBA program if they demonstrate an impactful approach to addressing the most pressing and often the most challenging social needs in Poland. The SBA program does not shy away from subjects that are rarely included in corporate social responsibility programs.


As public relations play no role in the SBA selection process, social purpose organizations pursuing difficult missions, such as social reintegration of ex-convicts or prevention of human trafficking, are often admitted into the program.

The selected organizations are typically small or medium-sized but with a desire to scale or improve their operations and extend the reach of their social impact.



They are led by passionate and dedicated social entrepreneurs who seek to truly improve the individual lives of their target beneficiaries. A key selection criterion for admission of a social purpose organization to the program is that such engagement has a direct impact on people's lives.

To date, **79 social purpose organizations** have benefited from participation in the SBA program. They are located throughout Poland and their areas of focus have included:



Impact

Overall, the program's impact on participating social purpose organizations has been great and beyond expectations. The key areas the mentoring support has focused on and succeeded in since the SBA program began have been:

The SBA program has helped SPOs extend and sustain their impact among direct social beneficiaries through capacity building within the organizations and targeted support of specific key projects. SBA participants have learned to become better organized, develop strategic and operational plans, access more diversified funding sources, recruit and allocate human resources more appropriately, focus on the most effective programs, consider impact measurement and management techniques and think and plan sustainably for the longer term.

Annual surveys of the participants show they have a very high regard for the program. What the participating SPOs value the most is access to the business community's otherwise inaccessible top level experience. The activities and achievements of each SBA program and its participants are summarized in annual reports that can be found on PSIK's website (www.psik.org.pl).




Another key impact of the SBA program has been the parallel creation of the Valores Foundation, Poland's first venture philanthropy fund. Valores was established in 2014 to provide promising social purpose organizations from the SBA program with direct financial backing as well as additional non-financial support (on top of the continuing involvement of the PSIK mentor). Once accepted to the Valores portfolio, a PSIK mentor typically commits to support the organization for an additional three years. A Valores board member and a Valores executive also join each support team.





14 SPOs from the SBA program supported



Below are several examples of how the SBA program worked in practice. We present selected outcomes brought about thanks to the PSIK mentors' involvement.

Fundacja Dobrych Inicjatyw helps children in foster care prepare for adulthood. It runs tailored programs that increase the youngsters' competencies and soft skills through personal engagement and cooperation with business. With the mentor's unflagging support, FDI developed a three-year plan to implement its unique model at 15 foster care homes in small towns and rural areas. Already in the first year, the number of children in the foundation's long-term program rose by 55%.

Fundacja Ocalenie supports migrants and refugees in Poland. At the start of the mentorship the foundation was in a dire financial situation due to its reliance on unpredictable public grants. Thanks to the collaboration, Ocalenie overhauled its fundraising by building a capacity for gaining corporate donors and crowdfunding. With added support from the Valores Foundation, the mentor also helped develop an affordable accommodation program, Welcome Home. Today, Ocalenie is financially stable, independent from public grants and immensely more effective.

Fundacja Pomost strives to limit delinquency and re-offence by working with prisoners and ex-convicts. Support by the mentor helped Pomost overcome dire financial problems and introduce a structured approach to operations and cash flow. The mentor brought in advisors who contributed to specific areas like communication, financial reporting, management and employment. The most important outcome is that Pomost achieved a breakthrough in the Polish resocialization system when its successful proprietary model was adopted by the Polish authorities.

Fundacja Sławek works with people who face social exclusion. Three years into the mentorship program, the foundation was already helping 80% more beneficiaries and investing 140% more per person. The professionalism of its services grew correspondingly. This collaboration also led to the development of three social economy brands.

Kamiliańska Misja Pomocy Społecznej helps people who experience homelessness. As debt is one of the obstacles people face when trying to rebuild their lives, the mentor worked with Kamiliańska to design and implement a personal bankruptcy filing procedure. With his support, the organization also developed an innovative program of assisted housing and built a more efficient fundraising function.

Stowarzyszenie BORIS is a consultancy for social purpose organizations. Assisted by the mentor, it developed a strategy for helping people with intellectual disabilities remain independent and avoid being institutionalized after their caregivers die. The organization went on to build a nationwide pilot program that proved a success and is expected to change how such persons are cared for in Poland.

Stowarzyszenie Otwarte Drzwi supports individuals who are at risk of social exclusion – people with disabilities, those experiencing homelessness, children from marginalized groups – and helps them become self-reliant. As the organization needed to improve its financial management, our mentor helped them build an integrated financial planning and monitoring tool that brought together all the projects and areas of activity. He also helped them diversify funding to increase the share of private and commercial sources. Other outcomes include an improved organizational structure, well-defined reporting lines and clear personnel decisions.

Acknowledgements

The SBA program would not be successful without the dedicated personal engagement of the PSIK mentors. They give their free time, which they would otherwise spend with family, friends or on other pursuits, to work determinedly on improving the social impact of the chosen organizations. It is a hands-on, roll-up-your sleeves approach to giving back to society with the objective to improve the lives of those less fortunate. Every single PSIK mentor deserves the heartfelt gratitude of the entire private equity and venture capital community.
